RECENT ASSIGNMENTS

- Won a motion to dismiss for a client in a Federal Syndicated Conservation Easement class action filed against 30 different defendants including lawyers, accountants, appraisers, promoters, and engineers. Claims included RICO, malpractice, negligent misrepresentation, breach of fiduciary duty, and fraud. Our client was one of only six defendants who were dismissed by the 251 page order.
- Shannon Sprinkle and Matt Gass secured a defense verdict after a two week plus trial for their national law firm client accused of wrongful foreclosure activities and GA RICO claims arising out of an alleged erroneous loan payoff.

Connect Staffing, Inc.*, 2022 WL 2187109 (N.D. Ga. May 31, 2022). In both cases, the court agreed that the employers' termination decisions were lawful and justified based on the employees' actions.
